6. Reports

6.1. Representative Reports

BUSD – Erin Biber reported that Benicia High is hosting a Special Olympics Basketball event on Saturday, January 20, 2024. They are increasing parent engagement by hosting "Coffee with the Director." BUSD has also reassembled its Special Education Task Force which they had started a few years ago.

DUSD – Andrew Ownby reported that Dixon is currently looking for a new superintendent for next school year. They also had a catastrophic power failure at one of their schools, which will take some time to fix. Right now, the school is running on generators while the district tries to relocate staff and students.

FSUSD – Andrew Ownby read an update provided by Nicole Smith. Fairfield-Suisun's Medi-Cal Collaborative has decided to spend funds to provide professional development opportunities for their staff. FSUSD's new Special Education Technician was able to have FSUSD CALPADs certified on time with the help of the Vacaville Unified School District and the SELPA. They continue to work closely with parents to solve issues that emerge through the new Special Education Liaison. They are finding creative ways to cover special education caseloads. Many retired special education staff have temporarily come back to help with caseload management. FSUSD is beginning the process of planning for the Extended School Year (ESY).

TUSD – Kristie Ballard reported that Travis is also in the beginning planning stages for the Extended School Year. They are also planning the Special Olympics Track & Field event scheduled for April 30, 2024. They are waiting for their board to come to a decision, either in February or March, about moving 6th grade from elementary school to middle school. **VUSD** – Angel Hixson reported Vacaville is closely looking at programming for next year focusing on inclusion opportunities for all students. They will also have a large number of students matriculating from preschool, which will impact staffing.

SCOE – Ilah Feeney reported that SCOE is presenting professional development for all their teachers on inclusive practices. The adult program is getting ready for its talent show in April. SCOE has also been planning for graduation.

North Bay Regional Center (NBRC) – Emily Koehler reported that there are flyers for the upcoming events for the NBRC on the sign-in table. These include Person-Centered Thinking training for family members who support individuals with disabilities and training for individuals with disabilities. There is also an informational session about who NBRC is and what they do. All of these are available by Zoom.

Independent Child Advocate – Dr. Amber Busay reported that she has been in this position for a year now and finds it very rewarding. She currently has 56 active clients. She received 8 new referrals in December but has had an influx of new referrals in January. She is getting ready to open her new office in downtown Fairfield.

6.2 Assistant Superintendents Report- Andrew Ownby presented an update on the Solano County SELPA's latest developments. Andrew highlighted legislation related to special education, CDE compliance improvement monitoring, and technical assistance support the SELPA provides its member districts, including professional learning activities.
