1. Call to Order –Kerry Pilley- Purcell called the meeting to order at 12:02 p.m.

2. Approval of the Agenda

Monica Hurtado made the motion to approve the agenda as submitted. Nicole Rabbani seconded the motion which was approved unanimously.

3. Approval of Minutes of February 25, 2021

Monica Hurtado made the motion to approve the minutes as submitted. Nicole Rabbani seconded the motion which was approved unanimously.

- **4. Summer Camp Presentation:** Susan Lebreque gave a presentation on the Joey Travolta Summer Inclusion Camp. This opportunity is open to North Bay Regional Center Clients aged 18 to 22.
- 5. Community Input Tobias Weare from the California State Council of Developmental Disabilities reported that the agency will be having a question-and-answer session March 19, 2021, regarding Covid 19 vaccines distribution for people with disabilities in California. Tobias will be running a Regional Advisory Committee on Monday, March 22nd. Tobias recently attended a presentation at the Independent Living Center regarding a program called WheelPad, which are homes that can be constructed for people that have serious injuries or illnesses that previously may have had to go to a rehabilitation center. This program is an alternative to that, much like a small home that can be constructed and attached to your existing home or structure. These homes are completely ADA compliant and allows the injured or ill person to be taken care of in the home.

Matrix Parent Network – Margaret Johnson reported on behalf of Matrix that they have partnered with a group called Sing, Dance, Play, to provide a free 8-week session of online music classes for children up to age 5 beginning next week. Matrix has several workshops coming up, some mentioned were Understanding IEP Goals, Welcome to your First IEP, Understanding Conservatorships and Behavior Intervention Plans.

6. Reports

Representative Reports

BUSD – Erin reported for the Benicia USD that the district is preparing for their hybrid, in-person learning beginning on the March 29th and preparing for ESY in June. The district is providing mental health supports to families, students, and staff. Benicia has a few open positions in their Special Education Department that they are looking to fill for next year.

DUSD – Judy Cecil reported that the Dixon USD had their students with intensive services and preschool students come back to school today. Monday March 22nd they will incorporate in their TK, Kindergarten and First grade. Thursday, March 25th the rest of their students will return.

FSUSD – Nicole Rabbani reported for FSUSD that the districts regionalized programs started back to school today with a hybrid model. On the 22nd they will have a staggered schedule return of their general education students. Fairfield's goal is to have all kids returning by the week after Spring break.

TUSD – Holly DeShazo reported on Travis USD's behalf that the district is preparing for their hybrid return of students to onsite classes on March 26th. Families were given the choice to remain in distance learning or return to classes in person. Travis's special programs with self-contained classrooms will begin 4 days per week, 4 hours per day. Related services will continue to be provided through distance learning until all students are back in person. Kristan Andrews from Travis was nominated and awarded as the Elementary Co-Administrator of the Year from the ACSA Solano Charter and Region 4. Her name has also been submitted to the State Committee for consideration for the ACSA State Award.

VUSD – Monica Hurtado reported that the VUSD Elementary students went back to in person learning today. Middle and High school students will start their hybrid model March 22, 2021.

SCOE – Tonya Roschen reported on behalf of the Solano County Office of Education (SCOE), that most if their classes have been operating small cohorts of in-person classes for 2 hours per day, beginning today that will increase to 4 hours per day, following each individual district protocol for returning students.

ICA – Carol Gonsalves reported that the families she works with seem to be reluctant to send their students back to in person learning for partial days because of the difficulty in transitioning. Carol has had 64 intakes so for this year, with about half of them being concerns with distance learning. She is having difficulty keeping up with what each different district is doing, as each district return schedules differ.

North Bay Regional Center – No Representative

Assistant Superintendent's Report —Andrew Ownby will be presenting at the Vacaville Board Meeting on how Special Education is organized in the State. Andrew reported that this week, AB 126, which relates to increasing funding for Family Empowerment Centers, was amended to include Early Start Family Resource Centers and to also require those agencies to spend 50% of the funds received to partner with SELPAs to provide ADR and IEP facilitations.
